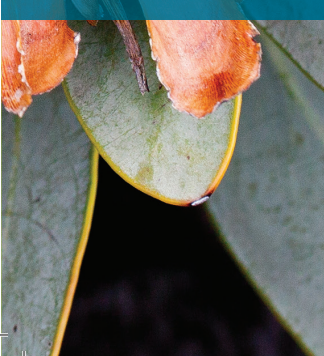

The outdoor classroom

Benefits of an outdoor classroom

- All programmes support and assist with classroom work
- An outdoor classroom offers an environment that enables cognitive and social development
- The teachers' progress takes place in an environment that stimulates learning

Developing social skills

- More space = less frustration and more cooperation
- Sharing an outdoor classroom environment = building better bonds with the group
- Group activities = problem solving
- Free movement = spontaneity

Cognitive development

- Using imagination = stimulating creativity
- Critical thinking = developing analytical skills
- Outdoors = excellent sensory perception opportunities (new things to touch, smell, hear and see)
- Decision making opportunities = problem solving and creative thinking stimulation (the outdoor environment varies more than an indoor one)
- Outdoors = opportunity to analyse and interpret information in a natural context

① Curriculum aligned programmes

Curriculum aligned programmes afford teachers the opportunity to apply learning in a meaningful way during the school term.

Outdoor lessons are designed to include topics that are being dealt with in the classroom at school. Both theoretical and practical contexts are covered.

Programmes can be tailored to suit specific needs and day programmes can be extended into overnight camps at certain venues.

③ Holiday programmes

Holiday programmes offer parents and schools a safe, educational environment for learners to spend their time outside of the school term.

Programmes are available to be held at libraries, schools or on reserve. Holiday programmes are fun, interactive and always include crafts and exploration. Currently all programmes are suited for age 8-12 years.

Wacky Water Warrior Programme	Clouds n puddles race, water cycle puzzle, wacky water arts n crafts, wetland investigation and/or mini SASS activity, Perfect Poetry	5 hours (can be tailor made to 1 or 3 hours if required)
Busy Bird Programme	Bird word search, birds of a feather race, Build-a-Bird, save the squawkers, who's a good bird hike (on reserve only)	5 hours (can be tailor made to 1 hour if required)



④ Volunteer based programmes

Volunteer based programmes vary from those that last a few hours to those that are more formal such as the Beyond Expectation Environmental Project (BEEP), the Junior Ranger and Citizen Science Programmes.

Day programmes usually coincide with environmental days and are appropriate for schools, corporates, adults, and learners alike.

Programmes are always offered with an element of learning and can be done during the school day or outside of it. Examples include invasive alien clearing and beach clean-ups.

All programmes below are for a duration of 3 days, 2 nights, starting at noon on day one and ending at noon on day 3.

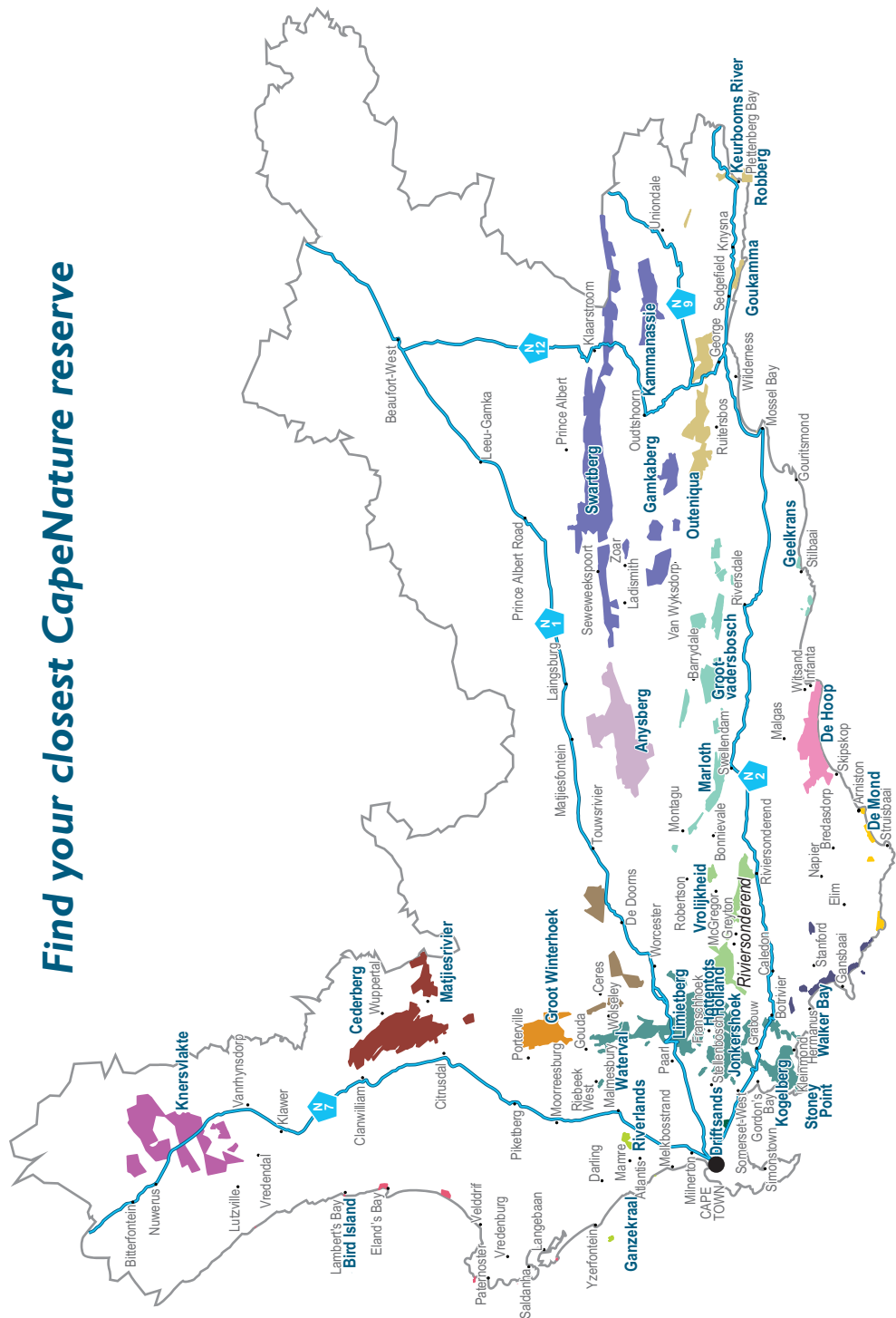
PROGRAMME NAME	AGE SUITABILITY	ACTIVITIES
Mix n match madness	Age 8-12	Camps can be tailor made through mix and matching a variety of activities in any other programme listed.
Self-facilitator	All ages	Camps can be self-facilitated by group leaders. An array of activities are available at each venue should the group wish to use these.
Critical curriculum	Age 8-12	Day 1: animal antics icebreaker, wicked war cries, winning with walking hike, funky food webs, super stars - stargazing, stories around a bonfire, got to guard! Day 2: environmental exercise starter (cardio) team builder time, beautiful bracelet making, fire fire 1, muddy hands propagation, evening amazing race. Day 3: super stretching (yoga), story time (indigenous water story), mission H2O (mini SASS activity), fabulous feedback (graffiti wall), winner takes it all (award ceremony to winning teams)
